All persons should be treated with respect, tolerance and compassion, regardless of the nature, origin, duration and place of the disaster. The dignity and rights of all disaster victims are respected and protected in all circumstances. Information sharing should promote mutual understanding, friendship, and cooperation.

- Prevent and alleviate suffering.
- Respect and active protection of dignity.
- Particular attention to the vulnerable.
